Testing is free and open to all regardless of symptoms. A phone number and name are required in order to receive testing results. Photo identification and proof of insurance are helpful, but not required. High demand for testing may result in long wait times. Testing locations may close early due to inclement weather or if daily testing supplies are exhausted.

Sidewalks, Driveways & Fire Hydrants

Pursuant to Village Ordinance, property owners are required to clear sidewalks of snow and ice within 24 hours of a snowfall. When clearing driveways, pile snow to the right of the driveway when facing the street to limit the snow throw back by plows. Village Ordinance prohibits dumping snow in the street when cleaning sidewalks and driveways. Residents are asked to remove snow and ice around the fire hydrants so they are clear and accessible to emergency fire crews. Your cooperation ensures the safety of our community.
