Village code 4-4-4 maintenance requirements-grass cutting. Grass and other vegetative growth shall not exceed eight inches (8") in height; the owner or occupant shall cut or caused to be cut to a height of less than eight inches (8").

Failure to comply could result in a fine or summons to court.
